'Pretty expensive for a toy'

Anyone interested in buying or leasing a small airport? If so, Robert Miller may have a deal for you.

Miller and his wife, Winifred, have a 15 3/4acre airstrip literally in their backyard. A few area pilots keep their planes parked there.

The Millers built Keymar Airpark, as the airport is officially known, in 1970 at the initial cost of about \$40,000 — "pretty expensive for a toy," Miller says.

He says he decided to build the airport when he started taking lessons to get his pilot's license. "I just enjoyed it, really," Miller says. "It's beautiful up there. I'd watch the traffic and how the roads would go."

But about seven years ago, he lost his desire to fly, and he has been trying to sell the airport for the past two years.

"I've not been trying to sell it too bad," he says, "but I'd like to get rid of it."

After caring for his "toy" for 25 years, Miller wants to hand the airpark to someone else.

Maintaining the airport requires, among other things, mowing the grass runway (2,000 feet long, 120 feet wide) twice a week in the spring and summer — a task that takes about six to seven hours each time. And whenever a plane happens to bust a runway light, the

When the airport first opened, "We had a flying club," Miller says. "It was a lot of fun."

Fellow pilots gathered for camaraderie and good food. But then, says Miller, the club had a run-in with the Internal Revenue Service about six years ago.

The IRS wanted the club to pay an amusement tax because food was sold at these events, Miller says. "They said that was an amusement, but it sure didn't make sense to me. So, we decided to disband the club and say the heck with it.'

The Keymar Airpark has been an attention-getter since it opened, Miller says. Curiosity seekers still stop by to inquire about the planes parked behind his home.
